Neighborhood School

- Students who live within the boundaries of a particular high school have automatic enrollment rights to the school's GENERAL PROGRAM, and will "roll" into this school if no other actions are taken.
- Parents do not have to go through any particular process to enroll in their neighborhood high school general program.

Specialty Programs

SCUSD has a variety of specialty programs and schools, including Small High Schools.

Open Enrollment Application

- Open Enrollment allows a student to apply for up to
 2 Specialty Dreament
 - 2 Specialty Programs
- Goes live October 30th. Closes November 17th.

- Open Enrollment does not allow students to apply for a school's general program.

SchoolMint

SCUSD has a new application interface called SchoolMint.
 SchoolMint is a streamline online application portal. SchoolMint will be accessed at the above link when live.

 Parent/guardians will create an account on SchoolMint and then add their student(s) using their name(s), date of birth, and student ID number. SchoolMint pulls in info from Infinite Campus to verify this information.

O.E. Application Choices

- Open Enrollment allows students to select up to 2 Specialty Programs.
 - If you get your 1st choice, you will not go into the lottery for choice 2
 - If you don't get your 1st choice, you go into lottery for 2nd choice.
 - If you get your 2nd choice, you are not placed on a waitlist for choice 1
 - If you really only want one program, only choose 1 option.
- To be entered into the lottery for any selected program, students must meet the required criteria, if there is a specified criteria.

Criteria vs. Non-Criteria Specialty Programs

- There are two CKM Specialty Programs that require criteria. Students need to take action in meeting this criteria through an additional step in the application process:
- VAPA requires portfolio submissions via Google Drive
- HISP has a self-nomination survey built into SchoolMint
- The VAPA portfolio instructions and HISP form will be accessed within the SCUSD School Mint application.

Dual Enrollment

Specialty Programs seats are filled with students who submit applications to SCUSD during the Specialty Program application window, October 30th - November 17th. Applicants must also meet specific requirements delineated by each program. The district holds a lottery for available seats if there are more applicants than seats.

After Specialty Program seats have been filled through SCUSD's lottery process with qualified applicants and all waitlist students have been admitted, seats may be available for those interested in dual enrollment to more than one academy. For example, if seats remain in VAPA, students in another Specialty Program may inquire with the CKM VAPA department.

Important Dates

- High School Specialty Program Application Period Monday, October 30th, 2023 through Wednesday, November 17th, 2023.
- Notifications of acceptance into chosen programs generally occurs mid-January.
- Be sure to read all instructions from SchoolMint once notified of lottery results.

Important Notes

- Encourage students to choose the program that meets their needs/interests. Visit, research, ask questions.
- Read each website and program requirements carefully.
- Be sure to apply online beginning October 30th for Specialty Programs.

9th Grade Teaching Teams
